



Dear visitor

Welcome to Hythe Bay Nursery. There are some rules we have in place to protect our staff, children and families from spreading or catching coronavirus. Please carefully read the rules below and speak to a member of Nursery staff if you'd like anything to be clarified for you.

Please sign in and provide your contact details for the track and trace system.

We will be adhering to government and NHS guidance for coronavirus and our managing children who are sick, infectious, or with allergies policy. The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- High temperature. This means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- New, continuous cough. This means coughing for a lot more than an hour, or three or more coughing episodes in 24 hours.
- Loss or change to your sense of smell or taste. This means even notice you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste differently to normal.

Most people with coronavirus have at least one of these symptoms.

If you or someone else in your household has symptoms which could indicate coronavirus, please book a test, call to let us know on 01303 267802 and stay home until you have self-isolated for sufficient time, following government and NHS guidance (usually 10 days). Please let us know if you test positive for the virus within 10 days of your visit to our nursery.

When on the school or nursery premises you will need to keep a 2m distance from other people, using the floor markers as a guide to help you. Please wear a face covering if you can. Please expect a queue at busier times, and walk on the right side of the corridor. You will need to wash your hands or use hand sanitiser at arrival and departure from Nursery. If you would like a discussion with a staff member or parent please arrange this via phone call or email.

If you display one or more symptom of coronavirus you will be asked to leave the nursery. Anyone displaying a symptom of coronavirus will be taken to an isolated area, along with their belongings. They will be cared for by a staff member, wearing PPE if necessary, until they are collected or leave. The symptomatic person and their household will need to isolate for 10 days, or until a negative test result is received.
